Sailing Instructions



1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in the 2005 – 2008 Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 Rules and Specifications of the International Shark Class Association (ISCA) will apply.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 A skipper's meeting will be held at 0900 on Saturday, September 10th under the BYC marquee tent.
- 2.2 Notices to competitors will be posted on the race results board located in the BYC clubhouse.

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions for course racing will be made at the Skipper's Meeting. This changes rule 88.2(c)

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at Britannia Yacht Club flagstaff.
- 4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in race signal AP.
- 4.3 When Flag B with a sound signal is displayed, means protest time has commenced. Upon the expiry of protest time Flag B will be lowered with a sound signal.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 A maximum of five course races are to be held.
- 5.2 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race is 1000 hrs. The warning signal for each succeeding race will be made as soon as practicable.
- 5.3 No warning signal will be made after 1600 hrs.

6 CLASS FLAG

The class flag will be a black shark on a green background.

7 RACING AREA

The racing area will be Britannia Bay between BYC and NSC.

8 COURSE

Attachment 'A' shows the course, including the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

9 MARKS

- 9.1 Marks 1, 2, 3 will be yellow tetrahedrons inflatable.
- 9.2 The starting mark will be a pole with a red flag.
- 9.3 The finishing mark will be a green tetrahedron inflatable.

10 THE START

- 10.1 Races will be started by using rule 26 with the warning signal given five minutes before the starting signal.
- 10.2 The starting line will be between the mast displaying the RC flag on a race committee boat and the starting mark. If a spacer mark is used, yachts shall not pass between it and the race committee boat.
- 10.3 A boat starting later than five minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start. This changes rule A4.1.

11 CHANGES OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

- 11.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move the original mark (or finish line) to a new position.
- 11.2 Compass bearing and change of length may not be displayed. This changes rule 33.

12 THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between the mast displaying the RC flag on a race committee boat and the finishing mark.

13 PENALTY SYSTEM

A boat that has taken a penalty or retired under rule 31.2 or 44.1 shall notify the race committee at the finish or after retirement from that race as soon as possible.

14 TIME LIMITS

- 14.1 If no boat has finish within 60 minutes of the start the race will be abandoned.
- 14.2 Boats failing to finish within 15 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish. This changes rules 35 and A4.1.

15 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 15.1 Protest forms are available at the race results board. Protests shall be delivered to the Regatta Chair within the protest time limit.
- 15.2 The protest time limit is one hour after the race committee boat has reached harbour after the last race of the day. This changes rules 61.3 and 62.2.
- 15.3 Notices of protests by the race committee will be posted to inform boats under rule 61.1(b).
- 15.4 Hearings will be heard in approximate order of receipt as soon as possible.

16 SCORING

- 16.1 The Low Point scoring system of Appendix A4.1 will apply.
- 16.2 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 17.3 One drop will be permitted after five races are completed.

17 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 17.1 Before the warning signal of her first race that day, each boat shall identify itself to and be acknowledged by the Race Committee.
- 17.2 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

18 PRIZES

The winner of the regatta will be awarded with the Hinterhoeller Trophy.

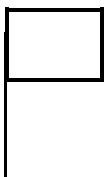
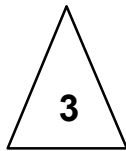
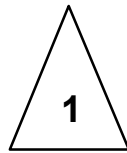
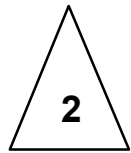
19 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

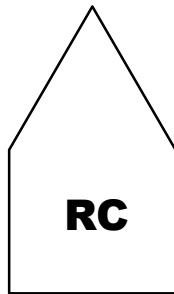
